

THE CANADIAN CARNEGIE INITIATIVE COM

\longrightarrow	SFU's leadership of and participation in the Carnegie Community Engagement Classification pilot and establishment in Canada. (www.sfu.ca/carnegie) SFU was the Canadian presenting partner in Canada of Carnegie's sector-leading Elective Classification for Community Engagement
	> 2019 - 2022 co-lead a group of 16 Canadian post-secondary institutions from across Canada to:
	learn about the philosophy and logic of the Classification
	participate in a trial Classification process, including engaging in the data collection, analysis and synthesis required to review and answer the questions in the Carnegie CE Classification framework
	work together as a learning community to identify needed adjustments to the existing Classification, recommend solutions and contribute to the development of a Canadian specific version of the Classification
\longrightarrow	In 2022, formulated recommendations for a Canadian classification, including guidance on governance, the framework itself (the questions), methods of consultation and the formation of a wider community of practice.
\longrightarrow	Just completed the official execution of the agreements between the Canadian Carnegie host institutions and the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching and its agent the American Council on Education to launch operations in Canada.
\longrightarrow	Expect to launch the first cycle of the Canadian Carnegie Classification for Community Engagement in fall 2024 which will create the first opportunity in Canada for post-secondary institutions to reflect deeply on their practices for and approaches to community engagement, considering their principles, partnerships and systems that advance high-quality, pervasive

community engagement within their institutions.
